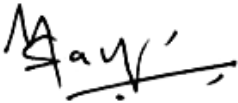

And finally in the eighteenth Chapter Lord said 18.65

मन्मना भव मद्भक्तो मद्याजी मां नमस्कुरु ।  
मामेवैष्यसि सत्यं ते प्रतिजाने प्रियोऽसि मे

Meaning: Always think of Me, become My devotee, worship Me and offer your homage unto Me. Thus you will come to Me without fail. I promise you this because you are My very dear friend.

The most confidential part of knowledge is that one should become a pure devotee of Krishna and always think of Him and act for Him. One should not become an official meditator. Life should be so molded that one will always have the chance to think of Krishna. He should arrange his life in such a way that throughout the twenty-four hours he cannot but think of Krishna. And the Lord's promise is that anyone who is in such pure Krishna consciousness will certainly return to the abode of Krishna, where he will be engaged in the association of Krishna face to face. This most confidential part of knowledge is spoken to Arjuna because he is the dear friend of Krishna.

Conclusion is Lord Shri Krishna is the supreme personality of God Head and he recommend in shloka 9.66 Abandon all varieties of religion and just surrender unto Me. I shall deliver you from all sinful reactions. Do not fear.

जो की अर्जुन से महान था

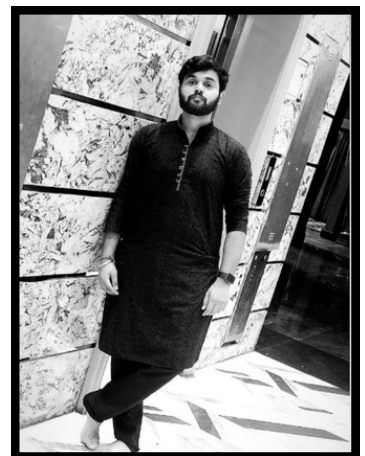

In conclusion, while it sounds challenging, building your professional network is fairly easy and is really important at the same time for your career growth.



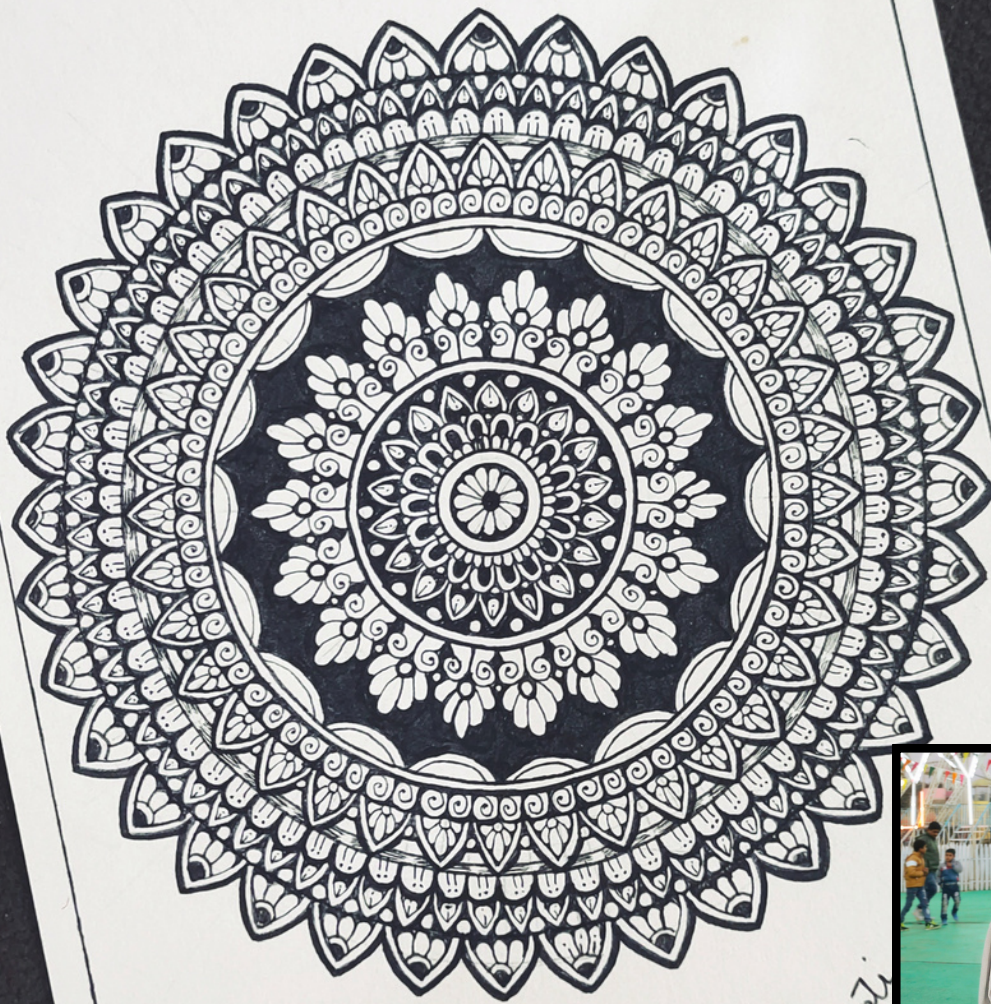

# My Mom- A Strong Warrior

April 2021. The month that changed me completely.

Since, December 2019, when the first variant of Covid-19 was discovered, the nations across the entire globe till date are facing its challenges- challenges to get a medication for the deadly virus, challenges to gain back the job opportunities which they lost during the period of lockdown and economic downfall, challenges to learn and explore new things, learn about one-self and majorly the challenge of letting-go of someone they loved.

The same happened to me, when on April 5, 2021, while working in my office, I started feeling semi-signs of the virus. The feeling of body-ache, nausea and fatigue took over me and thus, reaching back to my home felt like a ride that never ends. However, semi-signs? Semi-signs because, when I consulted the doctor and mentioned the symptoms, he assured me that the chances of the infection is low as there was no feeling of loss of taste, no cold or cough and that what I had got was maybe just a regular viral fever.

However, believing the assuring words of the doctor was the worst judgment that I made in my life and the fact that I got my positive report of covid just 4 days later in turn proved to be very late.

During my quarantine time, my mother-caught hold of the deadly virus, but a fighter as she always had been-she started fighting it with the same amount of confidence and commitment. The lady, so fond of music and pictures, started to spend a leisure time in her quarantine and to remove the feeling of isolation- played all her favorite songs and watched the recently launched movies on Netflix.

"You don't seem to have the virus,mom", I said to her while quarantining in the adjacent room. "Neither do I, dear" she replied with her dazzling smile and continued watching the latest movie "Roohi".

But hardly did we know that we might be this happy maybe for the last time as hour's later my mother started to feel low on oxygen and her oxygen level started to drop to 80s. Seeing this, quickly we ordered the oxygen cylinder at our place and tried to contact as many hospitals as possible for their assistance. That time, the country was fully engulfed in the virus's vicious circle and hence, no bed could be found even in the hospitals right next to our home.

However, my mom- how strong that lady always has been, continued to comfort her stressed out children and husband that she will work on it and will win the battle by her own will power.

She started with her breathing exercise, sat with the windows open to get some fresh air, coconut water, proteins, medications, use of oxygen cylinder, everything she did- she did with her strong commitment to win over the virus.

But maybe God had some other plans. On April 18,2021, her oxygen dropped to 30s which made everyone of us completely stressed out. We could see her hands turning blue and she slowly losing her consciousness. Eventually, every member of the house started to beg the hospitals to take her in emergency but was in vain. Four Hours of continuous calls later, the place where she had spent more than 30 years gave a ray of hope and had a vacant bed for Covid patients. My father, without worrying for his own health, rushed towards the hospital taking his discomfoted wife in his laps to Bahadurgarh, Haryana for her medical treatment. All her way, my mother sighed with pain and kept looking at her husband with eyes begging to have the complete look of him, maybe for he last time. Reaching to her professional-hometown, where she earned her bread and butter and spent her entire career, the doctors rushed her to the CT-Scan area and started performing the x-rays and ECG, but all that stuff came to sudden halt when my mother finally succumbed to her pain.

My father could not believe his eyes that his better half was no longer with him and since, the country declared Nation wide lockdown that time, he himself did all the ceremony all by himself while my sister and I, shocked that our mother had left for heavenly abode, waited for our father to return back home safe.

Covid Warrior? If it means that you have fought the battle and survived, then maybe not, but for me and my family, my mother is and always will be a warrior who fought this virus till her last breath and I am proud of that strong woman.

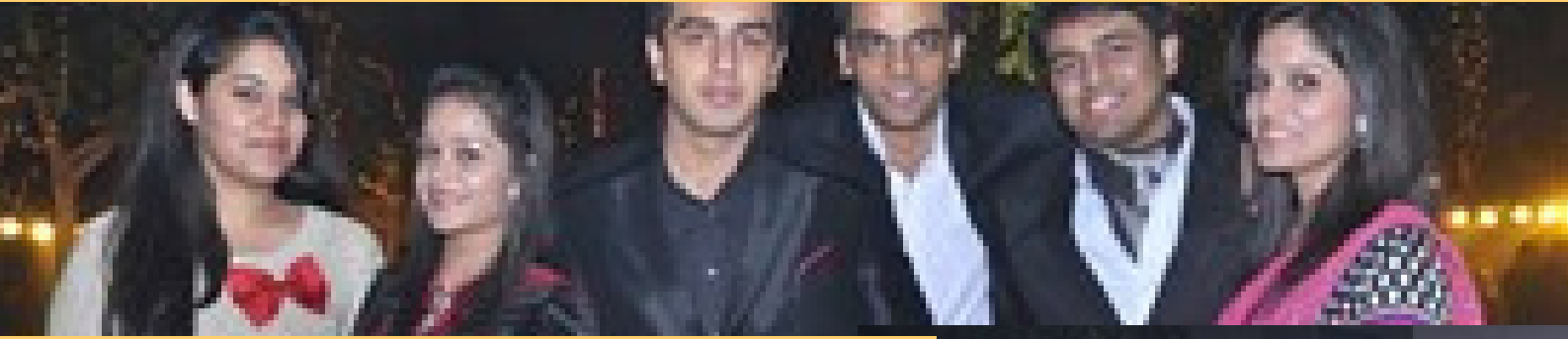
Her last words to me were while she was being taken to the hospital “Where do I have to go, I am coming back to the house, so you stop worrying.”

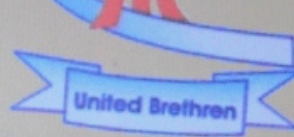
